History of MUN

Model United Nations (MUN) and International Model United Nations (IMUN) are educational simulations that replicate the workings of the United Nations, allowing participants to engage in global diplomacy and policy-making

The origins of MUN can be linked to the early 20th century, notably highlighted by Mir Mahmood's speech on October 5, 1922, at Harvard's Liberal Club. His call for support of the League of Nations, an early international organization aimed at promoting peace, helped inspire the creation of various international forums and the broader movement for global cooperation.

In MUN and IMUN, students role-play as delegates from different countries, debating and negotiating on global issues similar to actual UN proceedings. These simulations foster skills in public speaking, research, and diplomacy, reflecting the historical ideals of dialogue and international collaboration championed by figures like Mir Mahmood.

UNCSW



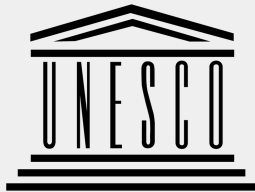
The committee discussed technology bias, and a DR from Saudi Arabia's bloc passed, marking a successful UNCSW session.

ECOSOC



ECOSOC met for three days on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, resulting in seven caucuses, two working papers, and a draft resolution.

UNESCO



Delegates at CGSMUN24 showed impressive growth in debate and diplomacy, contributing effectively to the cultural property agenda with their hard work and enthusiasm.

DISEC



DISEC, with 17 of 21 first-time delegates, had productive discussions and drafted a resolution that ultimately failed. They also attended a press conference and engaged actively.

UNSC



The UNSC discussed Middle East issues, including Palestine, Yemen, and Svria, over three days. A draft resolution with twelve votes was blocked by a Russian veto, reflecting the region's complexity



INTERNATIONAL PRESS

At CGSMUN24, IP addressed media bias in global diplomacy, focusing on how it incites violence. Press correspondents conducted interviews and attended conferences.



UNHRC

At the UNHRC, a South American resolution on refugee camps narrowly passed, while the Western proposal failed. Delegates collaborated to find an effective solution.



UNICEF

Despite being a beginner committee with few experienced delegates, UNICEF showed admirable perseverance, generating fruitful ideas to address the under-education of people with disabilities.



UNDP

UNDP's CGSMUN 2024 focused on "Sustainable Energy for Development," highlighting renewable energy, economic growth, and global cooperation for energy challenges.



UNODC

UNODC in CGSMUN'24 was focused on brewing fentanyl crisis in South Asia. Delegates Identified the Causes and tried to find feasible solutions to Counter the brewing Crisis and particular emphasis on the Golden Triangle
