In the capital, growing parental interest has encouraged CGSD to begin A' Level courses – drawing on CGS Upper's knowledge and support to guarantee excellence continues. Our Class of 2025 have enthusiastically registered and lessons are now underway with great success.

Meanwhile, in Chittagong, our NC school has partnered with NCUK (<https://www.ncuk.ac.uk/>), a globally respected pre-university programme provider. CGS NC will deliver an International Foundation Year developed with NCUK University Partners, effectively preparing students after SSC or O' Levels for direct university admission. Through the International Foundation Year, students gain subject expertise, academic skills and English proficiency, enabling them to progress to thousands of degree programmes across 60+ leading universities in the UK, Australia, New Zealand, the USA, Canada and beyond.

Additionally, **Rubaiyat Razzaque** transitions from Deputy Head to Head at CGSD. Since joining in March 2014, Rubaiyat has brought extensive experience in academics, teacher training, educational administration, and student life. We are confident Rubaiyat will lead our school with the vision, experience, and passion needed for its next chapter of growth and excellence. Please join us in congratulating her.

Our results are in, and we are delighted to share that our brilliant students at CGS and CGSD have achieved outstanding success, making us immensely proud. Our 'O' Level cohort shone brightly, with toppers **Afsheen** (CGSD), **Audri** (CGS), **Safwan** (CGS), and **Zarrar** (CGSD) each securing 10 A\*/As grades. In addition, 18 students earned 8 A\*/As, and another 13 achieved 9 A\*/As. At AS and A' Levels, 14 students attained 3 A\*/As each, while 23 secured 4 A\*/As. 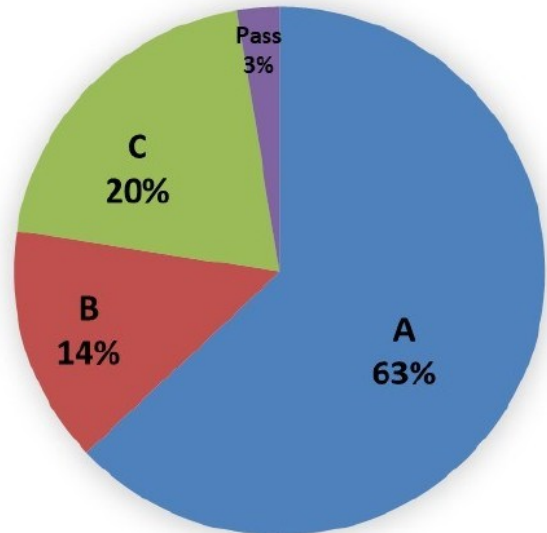
### O' LEVEL RESULTS 2025: CLASS 9

### O' LEVEL RESULTS 2025: CLASS 10

142 students appeared for the June 2025 O' level examinations. Combined CGS and CGSD results had an overall pass rate of 96% and an A\*, A and B ratio of 70%. 46% or 65 out of 142 candidates attained 5A's or more in O' levels.

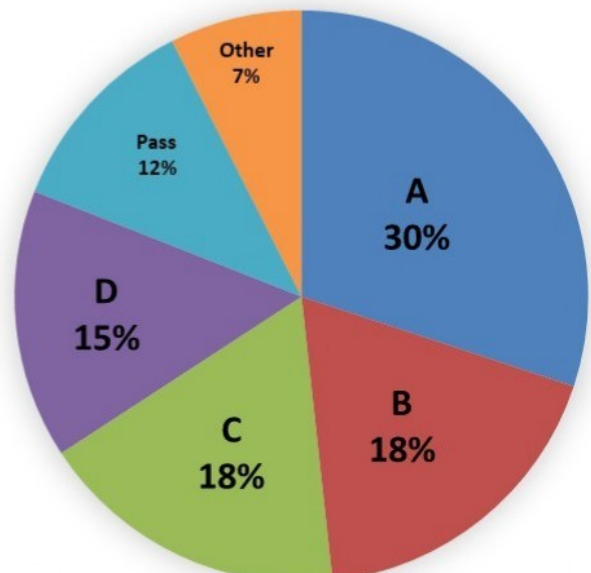

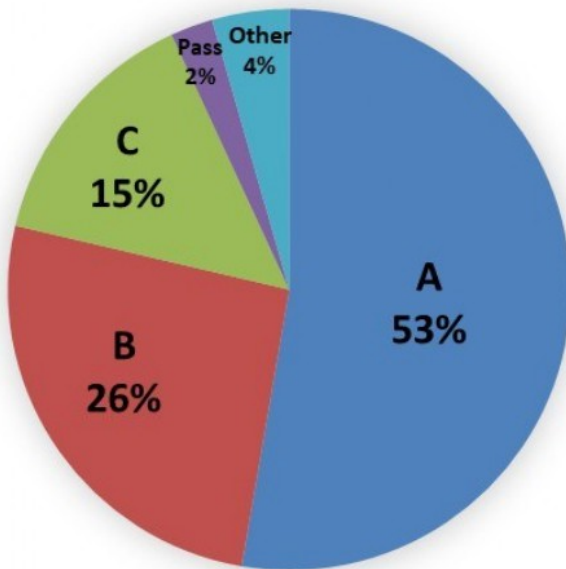
